Proposed ordinance's title/reference:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 28-30 "IMMOBILIZATION AND IMPOUNDING OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES" OF DIVISION 1 "GENERALLY" OF ARTICLE II "STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING" OF CHAPTER 28 "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF FORT MYERS BEACH, TO INCLUDE THE ACCEPTED METHODS OF PAYMENT OF ANY FINES AND CHARGES RELATED TO ILLEGAL PARKING AND IMMOBILIZATION OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, CONFLICTS OF LAW, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The proposed ordinance amends the existing language of Section 28-30 "Immobilization and impounding of illegally parked vehicles" of Division 1 "Generally" of Article II "Stopping, Standing and Parking" of Chapter 28 "Traffic and Vehicles" of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Fort Myers Beach, Florida, to restrict the accepted methods of payment of any fines and charges related to illegal parking and immobilization of illegally parked vehicles to a cashier's check or a money order, eliminating the violators' ability to later dispute the fines and charges paid to the Town with third party financial institutions. The proposed ordinance promotes the health, safety, welfare, and morals of the residents of the Town by allowing the Town to collect the fines and charges it is rightfully entitled to without engaging in disputes over the funds.
