AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 2 (A) OF ORDINANCE 2005-04 FOR CONSISTENCY WITH THE CHANGES TO THE TOWN CHARTER APPROVED BY THE TOWN VOTERS AT THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON MARCH 17, 2020; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, CONFLICTS OF LAW, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Ordinance 24-32 amends Section 2 of Ordinance 2005-04, changing the terms that conflict with the Town Charter, pertaining to the month of the election of the Town Mayor and Vice Mayor in non-election years. The proposed Charter amendment was approved at the municipal election in March 2020, but the changes were never incorporated into the Town Charter, necessitating adoption of an Ordinance 24-31, memorializing the proposed approved changes in the Town Charter. However, Ordinance 24-31 does not address the conflicting provisions of Ordinance 2005-04, which is why adoption of this proposed Ordinance is necessary to ensure consistency between Ordinance 2005-04 and the amended language of the Town Charter, as approved by the Town voters at the March 2020 municipal election. This Ordinance promotes public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the Town's residents by ensuring that the terms of Ordinance 2005-04 are consistent with the Charter amendments, as approved by the voters in 2020.
